3-way initiative for waste management



PEPSICO INDIA has joined hands with the NGO Exnora and the government of Tamil Nadu to set up

'The Exnora PepsiCo Environmental Training Institute' to provide training and awareness in solid waste management. The institute formed through a unique tripartite agreement, was inaugurated by state minister for rural development and local administration MK Stalin at Pammal in Chennai last week, finds Our Bureau in Chennai.
